Come for a few hours or spend a day with us and take advantage of a range of services and therapies. You can meet others, share experiences and take part in a range of relaxing activities.

Our expert team can help manage your symptoms, enhance your feeling of wellbeing and help maintain your independence for as long as possible. We have experience in helping people with emotional difficulties and can also address any practical concerns about money, equipment or services.

We also offer a range of safe and natural complementary therapies such as aromatherapy and massage, which may help to relieve anxiety and promote relaxation. Some activities and services are open to family and carers.

To make sure our care is linked to your goals we work in partnership with other professionals involved in your care – including your GP, district nurse, hospital consultant and specialist nurse.

Rehabilitation: living with your illness

This six week programme helps people affected by cancer and other illnesses to improve their quality of life. It is particularly useful for people who are experiencing fatigue following difficult treatments.

A gentle exercise programme combined with emotional support and practical advice will help you cope with everyday living and maintain your independence for as long as possible.
