What need does the service address?

With an ageing population growing faster than the national average, many of whom live in rural areas, NHS Dorset CCG identified a need for more end of life expertise and resources to help assess and care for patients who are eligible for CHC Fast Track funding.

93% of the **658** patients who received Marie Curie nursing care died in the place of their choice.²

How does the service work?

Our experienced Marie Curie Senior Nurses carefully assess each patient's Fast Track application so they can design a care package tailored to meet their needs. They also review each patient's needs on an ongoing basis, ensuring appropriate, high-quality care is still being provided to them and their family.

By managing this sensitive, resource-intensive process, Marie Curie saves the district nursing teams time, and relieves pressure on their team.

If the patient is being cared for in their own home, a team of qualified Marie Curie Healthcare Assistants is also available to deliver expert care according to their needs through a flexible combination of daytime and evening visits, and overnight care.
