### **Professor Paddy Stone MA MD FRCP**

Paddy Stone is professor of palliative and end-of-life care at University College London (UCL). He was educated at Wimbledon College, Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge and St Bartholomew's Hospital, London. He qualified in 1990, obtained the MRCP in 1993 and his MD in cancer-related-fatigue in 1999. He was appointed as Senior Lecturer in Palliative Medicine at St George's University of London (SGUL) in 2001 and was appointed head of the Marie Curie Palliative Care research Unit at UCL in 2014.

He has been a member of the Association of Palliative Medicine (APM) since 1993. He is the chair of the APM Science committee. He was a member of the National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) Palliative care clinical studies group 2003 - 2010. He was the Secretary of the Palliative Care Research Society (UK) 1999 - 2004.

His research interests include the mechanisms and management of cancer-related fatigue, prognostication in advanced cancer and quality of life and symptom assessment. He was the Chief Investigator on the Prognosis in Palliative care Study (PiPS), a national CRUK funded study of prognosis in advanced cancer.

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
